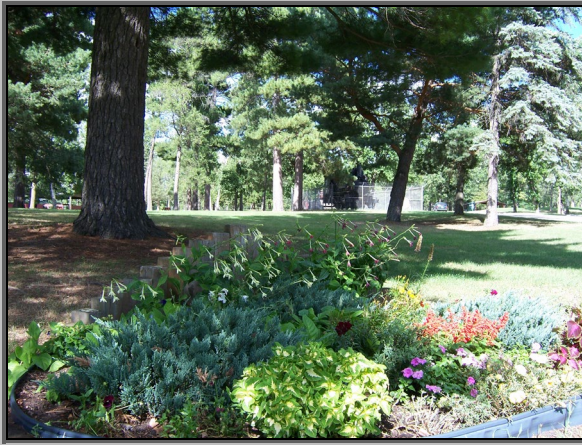

All campground sites have water and 30/50 amp electric hook-ups, Wi-Fi service, fire rings and picnic tables. A dump station is on-site at no additional charge to our campground guests.

There is NO tent camping or weekly/seasonal rates. A two-day minimum stay is required for holidays and weekends.

We begin taking reservations in January. ***Reservations are recommended.*** Call or e-mail us to reserve your campsite.

Check-in time is 1:00 p.m. Check-out time is 11:00 a.m. ***Weekend reservations are held until 4:00 p.m. on Friday unless a later check-in has been arranged.*** The city reserves the right to release the site after that time.

If you do not have a reservation, please check with the host or office staff for availability. The campground host is typically on-site 24 hours a day. Office hours are 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday-Friday located at 501 Laurel St.

A non-refundable deposit of the daily rate is required, per site, for holidays, NHRA week, and groups of three or more sites. Credit card payments can only be accepted during office hours. ***The campground host can accept cash or check payments ONLY.***

Firewood is for sale from the campground host. No firewood may be brought in or gathered on-site.



Please follow these guidelines:

1. Attach campsite marker card to post.
2. Pets are welcome. Animals must always be on a leash and attended to. Please clean up after your pets; there is a pet station located at the restroom facility.
3. No glass containers are allowed in the parks. No intoxicating beverage (alcohol) is to be consumed or displayed in public within the park.
4. Park only on the parking spurs, not between sites or in the brush. Extra cars must park at visitor parking areas.
5. To help protect and preserve our woodland areas, we must insist that **no firewood be brought in, or gathered on-site.** Firewood is available for sale from the campground host. Fires must be contained in the fire rings provided.
6. Please keep food in coolers or vehicles to discourage raccoons and skunks from becoming pests.
7. Be a good camping neighbor and keep all noise at the level of a quiet conversation or less after 10:00 p.m. Please have no outside radios on thereafter.
